

Poisonous animals 1.2 Common cobra

Scientific Name: Naja naja.

<u>Other Common Names :</u> Indian Cobra. <u>Geographical Distribution</u> : All over India.

Identification:

- 1. It is a distinctive snake growing up to 5 to 6 feet in length with a distensible neck that can be expanded into a hood.
- 2. On the dorsal side of the hood, there may be a monocellate (monocle) or binocellate (spectacle) mark.
- 3. The most important distinguishing feature of this snake is the fact that the **3rd** supralabial shield touches the eye and nose shield.
- 4. Also, a small wedge-shaped scale ("cuneate") is present between the 4th and 5th infralabials.
- 5. Another important feature is said to be the presence of 3 small scales just behind each eye.

Nature of Venom: Predominantly **neurotoxic.**

Antidote: Antisnake venom (ASV)
