

Poisonous animals 2.1 Non poisonous snakes:

Identification:

- 1. Head scales are large.
- 2. **Belly scales are small,** like those on the back or moderately large, but do not cover the entire breadth.
- 3. Fangs are short and solid.
- 4. They have several small teeth.
- 5. Tail is not much compressed.

Non-Venomous Snakebite

- A significant proportion of snakebites is said to be due to non-venomous snakes.
 Since the question of envenomation does not arise in such cases, systemic manifestations are non-existent, except those due to <u>psychological shock</u>.
- 2. As a result of the fear and apprehension associated with snakes, every bite (venomous or otherwise) is attended by some degree of shock characterised by giddiness, syncope, sweating, palpitation, tachycardia, and hypotension.
- **3.** Consequent upon reassurance especially by a doctor, about the non-venomous nature of the bite, these symptoms usually resolve rapidly.
