

Poisonous animals 2.2 Lycodon aulicus snake

Scientific name : Lycodon aulicus

Other common name : Indian Wolf snake

Identification :

- 1. Commonly seen around houses lured be geckos. Get their name from long, sharp front teeth similar to those of a wolf.
- 2. Small, slender snakes with smooth scales and white unmarked belly.
- 3. Color is mostly greyish brown while some individuals are even black.
- 4. Have somewhat thick bands usually white, some have bands with a yellowish tinge.
- 5. Distinct flattened head broader than neck, dark eyes with pupil invisible.
- 6. Often confused with Kraits as both have bands. Can easily be distinguished : Wolf snakes have broader & flatter heads, slightly thicker bands. Usually brown or grey, but a few can be black like kraits. Most importantly, Wolf snakes DO NOT have large hexagonal vertebral scales along it's back like kraits.

Nature of venom : Non Venomous.
