

Poisonous animals 3. Scorpion :

Scientific name : Scorpiones

Identification :

- 1. The scorpion has a **cephalothorax** (fused head and chest), an abdomen, and **a six segmented tail which terminates in a bulbous enlargement called telson.**
- 2. The telson contains the stinger and venom apparatus.
- 3. In addition, the scorpion also has two claws (chelae or pedipalps) which help to grasp its prey.
- 4. Scorpions differ in colour from straw yellow or light brown, to black.
- 5. Scorpions sting; they do not bite.

<u>Nature of venom</u>: The main toxins include <u>phospholipase, acetylcholinesterase,</u> <u>hyaluronidase, serotonin, and neurotoxins,</u> which causes gastrointestinal and pulmonary haemorrhages, and disseminated intravascular coagulation.

Antidote : Scorpion antivenom and Prazosin
