

Poisonous animals 4.3 Dragon fish:

<u>Scientific name</u>: Eurypegasus draconis / Stomiidae

Other common name: stalk eye fish, sea moth

Identification:

- It is the most venomous fish found in the Black Sea, Mediterranean Sea, Eastern Atlantic Ocean, North Sea, and European coastal areas.
- 2. Inject their venom from long "spines" that number from four to eight and are needle-sharp along the back of the fish.
- 3. They have large heads, a broad jaw, and protruding teeth. This protrusion is part of the reason that they have such a scary look, lending to their name as well.
- 4. Protruding fangs is the most distinctive feature of dragon fish
- 5. The spine of the fish is strong enough to penetrate through a leather boot.
- 6. Dragonfish can emit red light from their eyes

Nature of venom: cardiotoxic
