## D14 – HEPATOCELLULAR CARCINOMA



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## PRIMARY CARCINOMA LIVER

A male aged 45 years, was admitted in the Hospital with the complaints of pain in the abdomen, loss of appetite and weakness for the past 3 - 4 years. There was marked loss of weight and ascites. Examination showed enlarged liver not tender.

## MACROSCOPY:-

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- Specimen of the liver which is enlarged. 1)
- Cut-surface, shows 2 big nodules.
- Larger nodule measures about 10 x 8 cms in size. 2)
- Nodules are white in colour and they are well demar 3) -keted from the surrounding liver tissue. 4)
  - Upper nodule shows black area of necrosis and haemorrhage.
  - Small embolus in the hepatic vein. 5)

Shows the picture of Primary Carcinoma Liver with tumour HISTOPATHOLOGY:embolus in the hepatic vein.
