

D14 – HEPATOCELLULAR CARCINOMA

PRIMARY CARCINOMA LIVER

A male aged 45 years, was admitted in the Hospital with the complaints of pain in the abdomen, loss of appetite and weakness for the past 3 - 4 years. There was marked loss of weight and ascites. Examination showed enlarged liver not tender.

MACROSCOPY:-

- 1) Specimen of the liver which is enlarged.
- 2) Cut-surface, shows 2 big nodules.
- 3) Larger nodule measures about 10 x 8 cms in size.
- 4) Nodules are white in colour and they are well demarcated from the surrounding liver tissue.
- 5) Upper nodule shows black area of necrosis and haemorrhage.
- 6) Small embolus in the hepatic vein.

HISTOPATHOLOGY:-

Shows the picture of Primary Carcinoma Liver with tumour embolus in the hepatic vein.
